


History and Purpose

Founded in 1979, the mission of the Foundation for Free Enterprise Education (FFEE) is to provide Pennsylvania's youth with high quality and practical hands-on learning experiences that promote the ideals of business and the American free enterprise system. To fulfill this mission, FFEE operates three unique, impactful educational programs that provide students a solid foundation upon which to build stable, successful careers and futures.



FFEE's flagship program, PFEW was created in 1979 to teach high school students to understand and celebrate business and the American free enterprise system and help them develop skills that lead to professional and personal success.

That first program was held with approximately 100 students and 50 volunteers from northwest Pennsylvania. Today, PFEW is a statewide effort that serves over 1,700 students each summer with multiple week-long sessions in July and August on the campuses of Lycoming College and Pennsylvania College of Technology in Williamsport, PA. Over 52,000 young Pennsylvanians have benefited from this innovative concept in economic education. PFEW is a past recipient of the prestigious Freedom's Foundation of Valley Forge's National Award for Excellence in Economic Education.





SMG is an interactive, in-class online simulation of global capital markets. Students in grades 4-12 form teams and are given \$100,000 of virtual cash to invest in the markets. They conduct research, create an investment portfolio, and invest the money in real securities in real time

using an online platform as they compete against other teams in their region and age group for the highest return on their investment. The program helps students improve financial literacy, develop lifelong skills and take ownership of their financial future.

Here are the many opportunities for you to make an impact.



Each year, over 150 business professionals from across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the nation donate more than 10,000 hours to one of

three roles: Company Advisor, Speaker, or Judge.

Company Advisor (CA) – CAs act as consultants, mentoring a student company and posing questions to stimulate the students' thinking and learning process. They help their team get organized and assemble information to make sound business decisions, and foster teamwork to mine the gold in each team member. This is a one-week commitment.

*Educators can earn Act 48 credits while serving as a Company Advisor.

Speaker – PFEW Speakers address the students on various aspects of American business, free enterprise and professional development. Motivational Speakers impart inspirational, life-changing messages geared toward personal development. This is a one-day commitment.

Keynote Speaker – Keynote Speakers kick off the week with an inspiring message that ignites the students' enthusiasm for modern business and the journey they are about to take. This is a one-day commitment.

Judge – Judges evaluate one of two oral presentations at week's end, a Stockholders Annual Meeting or an Advertising Presentation, each counting 25% toward PFEW Top Company. Judges score the teams' overall understanding of these complex concepts. This is a one-day commitment.

Keynote Speakers share financial wisdom and knowledge that excites SMG participants about investing, financial literacy, careers and creating solid financial futures. This is a half-day commitment.
