Danville Child Development Center has been serving children ages birth to three years in the early intervention community since March 1974. Working as a team, our therapists, special instructors and service coordinator plan and deliver the best services possible for your child in the setting of your choice

Early intervention is a system of services that helps babies and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities. Early intervention focuses on helping eligible babies and toddlers learn the basic and brand-new skills that typically develop during the first three years of life, such as:

*physical (reaching, rolling, crawling, and walking);

*cognitive (thinking, learning, solving problems);

*communication (talking, listening, understanding);

*social/emotional (playing, feeling secure and happy); and self-help (eating, dressing).

To determine eligibility, children participate in a play-based evaluation. Infants and toddlers, ages birth-3, who are determined to have special needs due to a developmental delay or diagnosis are then eligible to receive Early Intervention Services. **These services are free and have no income guidelines.**
