Stephanie Schmitt-Grohé is a professor of economics at Columbia University, a research associate of the NBER and of the CEPR. Previously, she taught at Rutgers University and Duke University. Schmitt-Grohé started her career as an economist in the Division of Monetary Affairs at the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System, in Washington. Her research focuses on monetary policy and on understanding the sources and propagation of macroeconomic shocks within and across countries. In 2005, her work was honored with the Bernácer Prize, awarded annually to a European economist under the age of 40, who has made outstanding contributions in the fields of macroeconomics and finance. She has published widely in economic journals and is the coauthor of the 2017 Princeton University Press graduate textbook "Open Economy Macroeconomics" (joint with Martín Uribe). Besides teaching at Columbia she is a regular research visitor at the European Central Bank.
